

## Structure

Over 30 teaching stations are mounted around the **BETTER LIVING CENTRE** each of them taught by a knowledgeable Aboriginal instructor.

Stations will include topics such as hands-on crafts, games, languages, storytelling and more. (Program subject to change.)



A Grand Entry of traditional dancers will enter the building at 9:30 a.m. accompanied by drumming and singing. Then at 10:00 a.m., teaching stations are scheduled. More dance demonstrations will take place at

12:45 p.m. This activity is a highlight of the day for many students and teachers.

The content of the day is based on the Ontario Curriculum. It is suitable for elementary grades.

There is a limit on the number of students accepted for the day. **AVOID DISAPPOINTMENT BY BOOKING EARLY. THE EVENT SELLS OUT ANNUALLY.**

## Topics

The majority of presentations for Education Day 2011 will be participatory. Teachers will be encouraged to select their own schedule. Most of the participatory stations will include a number of presentations and, like all others, will be repeated every half hour to give teachers an opportunity to have their students participate in most.



### HANDS-ON CRAFTS

Students will learn to make their own mystery bracelet. Each student will receive a kit which they can make on site or in the classroom.

### TRADITIONAL GAMES

Students will participate in a number of games that were developed to teach important skills.



### SPECIAL VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

Demonstrations of items such as Hoop Dancing, Hand Drumming, traditional songs and skits based on traditional stories.

### LACROSSE

Students will have the opportunity to practice a number of lacrosse skills.



### MARKET AREA

Always popular - a market area of many vendors demonstrating and explaining the importance of the items.

### TRADITIONAL DANCE

A demonstration of Pow Wow dancing. A number of students will be available to participate in traditional dancing.
